*Julius Edwards*and to *his* heirs, the said tracts above described: To have and to hold the same, together with all the rights, privileges, immunities, and appurtenances, of whatsoever nature, thereunto belonging, unto the said*Julius Edwards*and to *his* heirs and assigns forever.In Testimony Whereof I, *James Buchanan*
